This Week’s Lesson at a Glance

Lesson Title: God Creates People for Relationship

Bible Passage(s): Genesis 2

Big Idea: God lovingly created people to know Him, talk with Him, and live in relationship with Him.

Memory Verse

“The Lord God formed a man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life.” (Genesis 2:7)

Today Your Child Learned

Your child learned that God did not create people by accident. God personally formed the first man and breathed life into him. God placed people in a beautiful garden, gave them meaningful work, and showed that people were created for relationship—with God and with one another. Your child also learned that God created woman from the man’s side on purpose. This shows that husbands and wives are meant to love one another, help one another, and work together as one team in God’s design for marriage.

Why This Lesson Matters

Genesis 2 shows us God’s heart. God is not distant or uncaring. He wants to be close to His people. From the very beginning, God created people to walk with Him, talk with Him, and trust Him. This lesson also prepares children to understand why Jesus is needed when sin later breaks the relationship God created.

Defending the Truth at Home

Question: Are people just animals?

Answer: No. God made people in His image so we can know Him and love Him.

Scripture to Read Together: Genesis 1:26–27

Talk About It at Home

Family Discussion Question: What does it mean that God made you on purpose?

Optional Follow-Up Question: How can our family talk with God and trust Him together this week?

Try This as a Family

Take a few minutes to thank God together for how He made each person in your family. Let each family member name one thing they are thankful God made them able to do.

Prayer to Pray Together

Dear God, thank You for making us with care and love. Thank You that You want to know us and walk with us. Help us trust You and talk with You every day. Amen.

A Final Thought for Parents

You do not have to have all the answers. Simply opening God’s Word and talking about it together plants seeds of faith. God is faithful to grow what is planted as you point your child to Him.
