

# WEEK 3 – PARENT TAKE-HOME SHEET

## The Fall: Sin Enters the World & God's Promise Begins

### Genesis 3

#### THIS WEEK'S LESSON AT A GLANCE

**Big Idea:** Even when people disobeyed God, He does not stop loving them. God allowed judgment because He is holy, but He immediately began His loving plan to rescue through Jesus.

#### MEMORY VERSE

"Where are you?" (Genesis 3:9)

God came looking for Adam and Eve, inviting them to come back to Him instead of hiding.

#### TODAY YOUR CHILD LEARNED

Your child learned how sin entered the world when Adam and Eve disobeyed God. Sin brought fear, shame, and separation from God, which is why the world is broken today.

They also learned that God is holy and truthful, so He allowed judgment to come. Sin has real consequences.

Most importantly, your child learned that judgment was not the end. God immediately promised a Savior who would defeat evil. This promise points to Jesus.

#### WHY THIS LESSON MATTERS

This lesson helps children understand why the world is not perfect, why everyone needs a Savior, and how God's love is stronger than sin.

Jesus lived without sin, died for our sins, and rose again so we can be forgiven and brought back to God.

#### DEFENDING THE TRUTH

**Question:** If God loves us, why did He bring judgment?

**Answer:** God is loving and holy. Sin is serious, but God immediately promised a Savior.

**Read Together:** Genesis 3:15; Romans 6:23

#### TALK ABOUT IT AT HOME

Why do you think Adam and Eve hid from God? What should we do when we make wrong choices today?

#### TRY THIS AS A FAMILY

Play a short game of hide and seek. Talk about how God asked, "Where are you?" because He wanted Adam to come to Him. God invites us to come to Him, not hide.

#### PRAYER TO PRAY TOGETHER

"Dear God, thank You for loving us even when we make mistakes. Thank You for sending Jesus to rescue us. Help us come to You and trust You. Amen."

#### A FINAL THOUGHT FOR PARENTS

If your child is beginning to understand sin and forgiveness, that is healthy growth. Keep conversations gentle and hopeful. God is at work.
