What Jesus Has Done for Us

Student Homework

Main Truth

Jesus died for our sins, was buried, rose from the dead, and offers forgiveness and life.

What You Will Need

- Your Bible (NKJV if available)
- A notebook or these pages
- A pen or pencil

No outside study tools this week

Stay in the Bible text. If you do not know an answer, write down the question and bring it to the next meeting.

Suggested Plan

- Study Period 1: Luke 23:32-49, about 20-30 minutes.
- Study Period 2: Luke 24:1-12, about 20-30 minutes.
- Study Period 3: 1 Corinthians 15:1-4, Romans 5:8, response and prayer, about 20-30 minutes.

Before You Begin

*God, help me understand Your Word. Help me see what is true and respond with faith and obedience.
Amen.*

Study Rule

Read first. Notice what the Bible says. Ask good questions. Do not guess when the passage does not give the answer.

Study Period 1: Jesus Died

Read Luke 23:32-49 twice

First reading: Follow what happens. Second reading: Slow down and notice who is present, what Jesus says, what happens around Him, and how people respond.

Answer From the Bible

1. Who was crucified with Jesus? Write the verse number beside your answer.

2. What did Jesus ask the Father to do for the people who were crucifying Him?

3. What did one of the criminals say to Jesus, and how did Jesus answer him?

4. What happened from about the sixth hour until the ninth hour?

5. What happened to the veil of the temple?

6. What did Jesus say just before He died?

7. How did the centurion respond after seeing what happened?

Use the Six Questions

WHO?

Who is present? Who speaks? Who acts? Who responds?

Who. List the main people or groups you notice in Luke 23:32-49.

WHAT?

What happened? What did Jesus say? What did the people do?

What. Write three things that happened in this passage.

WHY?

Ask why only when the passage gives you enough information. If it does not, write the question down instead of guessing.

Why. Why do you think Luke included Jesus' words and the different responses around the cross?

What can you say from the passage itself?

If you are unsure, write: 'I need help with this question.'

HOW?

How did different people respond to Jesus?

How. Compare the responses of the rulers, the soldiers, the criminals, and the centurion.

What This Passage Shows

8. What does this passage show you about Jesus in His suffering and death?

Study Period 2: Jesus Rose

Read Luke 24:1-12 twice

First reading: Follow the story. Second reading: Notice who came to the tomb, what they expected, what they found, what they were told, and how people responded.

Answer From the Bible

1. Who came to the tomb early in the morning?

2. What did they find when they arrived?

3. What did the two men in shining garments tell them?

4. What did the women remember?

5. What did the women do after leaving the tomb?

6. How did the apostles respond to their words?

7. What did Peter do?

Use the Six Questions

WHO?

Who is present? Who speaks? Who receives the message? Who responds?

Who. List the people or groups in Luke 24:1-12.

WHAT?

What happened?

What. Write the events in simple order from the women arriving at the tomb to Peter leaving it.

WHERE?

Where did this happen? What place does the passage name?

Where. Where were the women when they received the message that Jesus had risen?

WHEN?

Look for time words or order words. Do not build a full Bible timeline yet.

When. What time information does verse 1 give? What happened after the women returned from the tomb?

HOW?

How did people respond?

How. How did the women, the apostles, and Peter respond differently to the news?

What This Passage Shows

8. Why is the empty tomb good news? Answer from what this passage shows.

Remember

The tomb was not the end of the story. Jesus really died, Jesus really was buried, and Jesus really rose.

Study Period 3: The Gospel in Plain Words

Read 1 Corinthians 15:1-4 three times

Read slowly. On the second reading, notice what Paul says is 'of first importance.' On the third reading, look for the basic facts of the gospel.

Find the Gospel Facts

1. According to verse 3, what did Christ do, and why did He do it?

2. According to verse 4, what happened after Jesus died?

3. What phrase appears in both verses 3 and 4 to show that these events fulfilled God's Word?

Write the Gospel in Four Simple Parts

Part	Truth
1	Jesus died for our sins.
2	Jesus was buried.
3	Jesus rose from the dead.
4	Jesus offers forgiveness and life.

Explain It in Your Own Words

4. In two or three sentences, explain what Jesus has done for us. Use 1 Corinthians 15:1-4 as your guide.

Practice Teaching It

Read your answer out loud as though you were explaining the gospel to someone who has very little Bible knowledge. Keep it simple, clear, and centered on Jesus.

5. What part was hardest to explain clearly?

Memory Scripture: Romans 5:8

**“But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners,
Christ died for us.”**

Romans 5:8, NKJV

- Read the verse aloud five times.
- Say the reference before and after the verse.
- Cover part of the verse and try to say it from memory.
- Explain the verse in your own words.

6. What does Romans 5:8 teach you about God's love and our need for Christ?
