

## PARENT TAKE-HOME SHEET Reach Community Church – Children’s Ministry

### THIS WEEK’S LESSON AT A GLANCE

Lesson Title: God Calls Abram: Faith Begins with Trust Bible Passage(s): Genesis 12:1–9 Big Idea: Faith means trusting and obeying God, even when we do not know all the details.

### MEMORY VERSE

“The LORD had said to Abram, ‘Go from your country, your people and your father’s household to the land I will show you.’” (Genesis 12:1)

Tip for Parents: Talk with your child about what it means to trust God when we feel unsure or afraid.

### TODAY YOUR CHILD LEARNED...

Your child learned that after the Tower of Babel, when God created many languages and people spread across the earth, God began something new by calling one man named Abram. God spoke to Abram and asked him to leave his home and trust Him. Abram obeyed, even though he did not know where God was leading him.

Children also learned that we still see evidence of Babel today because people around the world speak many different languages. This reminds us that the Bible is true and trustworthy.

### WHY THIS LESSON MATTERS

This lesson teaches children that God speaks, keeps His promises, and can be trusted. God’s promise to Abram was not only for him—it was God’s plan to bless the whole world through Jesus Christ. Faith begins by trusting God’s Word and choosing obedience over fear.

### DEFENDING THE TRUTH (AT HOME)

A Question Children Often Ask: How do we know when it is God talking to us?

A Simple Biblical Answer: God speaks most clearly through the Bible. God will never ask us to do anything sinful, unsafe, or against His Word. God’s voice always agrees with Scripture.

Scripture to Read Together: Psalm 119:105; 2 Timothy 3:16; 1 Samuel 3:1–10

### TALK ABOUT IT AT HOME

Family Discussion Question: If God asked you to do something that felt scary but was right, how could you trust Him?

Parent Guidance: Help your child understand that feeling scared does not mean we are doing something wrong. Talk about times you have trusted God even when you felt unsure. Remind your child that God promises to be with us and help us when we trust Him (Isaiah 41:10).

Second Family Discussion Question: One thing God asks His people to do—even when it feels scary—is to tell friends and family that they need Jesus to forgive their sins. How can we trust God and overcome fear so we can do what He wants us to do?

Parent Guidance: Explain that sharing about Jesus does not mean arguing or forcing someone to believe. It means loving others, telling them the truth, and trusting God with the results. Remind your child that God gives courage through the Holy Spirit and that God is always with us when we obey Him (Matthew 28:20).

#### TRY THIS AS A FAMILY

Take a short walk together and talk about trusting God step by step. Pray together and thank God for guiding your family, even when the future feels uncertain.

#### PRAYER TO PRAY TOGETHER

“Dear God, thank You for loving us and keeping Your promises. Help us trust You and obey Your Word, even when we feel unsure. Thank You for sending Jesus to forgive our sins. Amen.”

#### A FINAL THOUGHT FOR PARENTS

God is at work in your child’s heart. Small conversations about trust and obedience can make an eternal impact. Keep pointing your child to Jesus, who is always faithful.
