THIS WEEK'S LESSON AT A GLANCE

Lesson Title: God Keeps His Promises to Abraham

Bible Passage(s): Genesis 15; Genesis 21:1–7

Big Idea: God always keeps His promises, and we can trust His Word.

MEMORY VERSE

"Is anything too hard for the Lord?" (Genesis 18:14)

Tip for Parents: Encourage your child to repeat this verse when they are waiting or facing something that feels difficult.

TODAY YOUR CHILD LEARNED...

Your child learned that God made a promise to Abraham that seemed impossible. Abraham was 100 years old and Sarah was 90 years old when their son Isaac was born. Humanly speaking, this could not have happened—but God kept His promise exactly as He said He would. The Bible tells us that Abraham believed God, and years later God did what only He can do. This lesson showed children that God's Word is always true and that God never forgets or fails to keep His promises.

WHY THIS LESSON MATTERS

This lesson helps children understand that the Bible can be trusted and that God is faithful. It also shows how God has been working throughout history to rescue people from sin. God's promise to Abraham points forward to Jesus, who came to save us and bring us back into a right relationship with God.

DEFENDING THE TRUTH (AT HOME)

A Question Children Often Ask: Did God really give Abraham a baby when he was very old?

A Simple Biblical Answer: Yes. The Bible tells us that Abraham was 100 years old and Sarah was 90 years old when Isaac was born (Genesis 21:5). This shows that Isaac's birth was not an accident or a mistake—it was a miracle from God. God did exactly what He promised, proving that nothing is too hard for Him.

Scripture to Read Together: Genesis 21:1–2

TALK ABOUT IT AT HOME

Family Discussion Question: Why do you think it was hard for Abraham and Sarah to wait?

Optional Follow-Up Question: How can we trust God while we are waiting for something?

TRY THIS AS A FAMILY

Go outside at night and look at the stars together. Remind your child of God's promise to Abraham in Genesis 15:5. Talk about how God keeps every promise He makes.

PRAYER TO PRAY TOGETHER

"Dear God, thank You for loving us and for always keeping Your promises. Help us trust You, even when waiting is hard. Thank You for sending Jesus to save us. Amen."

A FINAL THOUGHT FOR PARENTS

God is at work in your child's life, even in small moments. As you talk about God's faithfulness together, you are helping build a strong foundation of trust in God's Word.
