## THIS WEEK'S LESSON AT A GLANCE

**Lesson Title:** Isaac & God's Faithfulness

**Bible Passage(s):** Genesis 22:1–19

**Big Idea:** God is faithful and will always provide what we truly need.

---

## MEMORY VERSE

*"So Abraham called that place The Lord Will Provide. And to this day it is said, 'On the mountain of the Lord it will be provided.'" Genesis 22:14*

**Tip for Parents:** Practice saying the verse together at bedtime this week. Emphasize the words "The Lord Will Provide." Ask your child what God provided in the story.

## TODAY YOUR CHILD LEARNED...

Your child learned about the time God tested Abraham in Genesis 22. God had promised that His rescue plan for the world would come through Abraham's son Isaac. Then God asked Abraham to trust Him in a very difficult way.

Abraham obeyed because he believed God would keep His promise. At the last moment, God stopped Abraham and provided a ram instead of Isaac. The ram took Isaac's place.

This powerful moment teaches us that God is faithful. He keeps His promises. He provides exactly what we need at exactly the right time.

## WHY THIS LESSON MATTERS

Genesis 22 points directly to Jesus.

Just as God provided a ram in place of Isaac, God provided His own Son, Jesus, to take our place. Jesus died on the cross for our sins and rose again so we could be forgiven and have eternal life.

This lesson reminds us that God can always be trusted. Even when we do not understand His plans, He is faithful. He is our Provider. He is our Savior.

## DEFENDING THE TRUTH (AT HOME)

**A Question Children Often Ask:** Why would God ask Abraham to do something so hard?

**A Simple Biblical Answer:** Genesis 22:1 tells us that God tested Abraham. God stopped Abraham before Isaac was harmed (Genesis 22:12). This was a unique test that showed Abraham's faith and pointed forward to Jesus.

**Scripture to Read Together:**

*Romans 8:32 "He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?"*

## TALK ABOUT IT AT HOME

**Family Discussion Question:**

What does it mean to trust God when we do not understand everything?

**Optional Follow-Up Question:**

Can you think of a time when you had to trust someone even though you did not see the whole plan?

## TRY THIS AS A FAMILY

Draw a simple mountain on a piece of paper. At the top, write: "The Lord Will Provide." Beneath it, write down one thing your family needs to trust God with this week. Pray together and ask God to help you trust Him.

## PRAYER TO PRAY TOGETHER

*Heavenly Father, thank You for being faithful. Thank You for providing for Abraham and Isaac. Thank You most of all for providing Jesus to take our place. Help our family trust You, even when we do not understand everything. Amen.*

## A FINAL THOUGHT FOR PARENTS

Faith often grows in moments of uncertainty. Genesis 22 reminds us that God's character never changes. He is faithful to His promises. As you lead your child, remember that small conversations, simple prayers, and steady trust make a lasting difference. God is at work in your family.
